3 Insert PIN connector into organizer blue clip.







case in point : patient portal

- the emotional state of patients has a profound impact on their ability to use our technologies

reduce patients' anxiety

-h's narrow



by offering one, simple set of instructions, we could reduce their cognitive load, and hence, their level of stress — unless, of coure, they have a leech.

make the experience more human

by incorporating sounds from nature, like that of a gently flowing fountain, we could create something closer to a soothing, meditative experience







by adopting gentler alerts rather than harsh alarms, much unnecessary stress could be alleviated



add mobility for capd patients

in place of a stationary iv pole, mimic camelbak's system of carrying a "bladder" full of fluid in a modified backpack, so fills could be done while a patient goes about doing their normal daily routine



recycling disposables waste

transform the large volume of trash into something useful
