


# About Mystic, CT, and Activities for Guests and Families:

The 2001 social program has been planned to be of interest to all ages, and we hope that many of you will take advantage of the many offerings and include your families.


Luncheon: Upon arrival on Friday, you, your family, and guests are invited to partake of a complimentary buffet luncheon in the NECS meeting reception area.





# Guest and Spouse Program





Boston, one of New England's largest cities, is rich in history, commerce, education, culture, and visitor activities, and can justifiably be called the hub of the six-state region. Many of the reasons to visit Boston include its fine dining, arts and culture, historic architecture and museums.

# **NECS Meeting Headquarters**

Standing along the Charles River, the Royal Sonesta Hotel offers sweeping Boston views, magnificent accommodations, choice dining and a luxurious health spa. 
# **Livingston Taylor in Concert**

# **Guest and Spouse Program**

Saturday's program will feature an Architectural Bus Tour of Boston. Boston is an architectural showcase spanning three centuries of work from Charles Bulfinch to H.H. Richardson to I.M. Pei. From The Government Center, Faneuil Hall, the State House and Back Bay to Beacon Hill, informative guides will lead you back in time to sense the history and artistic traditions that shaped the magnificent buildings of the city. As a portion of the tour includes wandering the streets of Beacon Hill, comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Free admission to the MFA is included with the tour, so participants have the option of the spending a leisurely afternoon there. Also recommended is the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum (one block away) with its collection of paintings, sculptures, and decorative arts, and its lovely Venetianinspired courtyard in bloom.

# **Activities for Guests & Families**

Boston's Museum of Science stands on the Charles River Dam Bridge, a very short walk from the Sonesta Hotel. The Museum is on the cutting edge of science education, developing innovative and interactive exhibits and programs that both entertain and educate. The museum includes the Omni Theater and Charles Hayden Planetarium, with many interesting and educational programs shown daily.

Powers of Nature: A new exhibit opening this fall will feature tornadoes shooting a plastic straw into a telephone pole like an arrow into a bull's-eye; hurricanes capable of bending a tree trunk to a 90-degree angle; and lightning generating enough heat to turn sand into glass. In this traveling exhibit developed by The Franklin Institute in Philadelphia, witness amazing evidence of

nature's strength and unpredictability. Then delve into the science behind natural disasters — how they are studied and predicted, how they affect our lives, and how we can protect ourselves.

Visit the **New England Aquarium** on Central Wharf, with more than 2,000 aquatic animals from starfish to piranha, as well as sharks, turtles, penguins, and sea lions. Play at the **Children's Museum** in South Boston was never so much fun, or as educational, as in this renovated Fort Point warehouse with four floors of activities (and a couple of labyrinths in between). The **Arnold Arboretum** in Jamaica Plain is a 265-acre park and forest with over 6,000 kinds of trees and shrubs. Designed by America's first landscape architect, Frederick Law Olmsted, this historic landmark is the oldest arboretum in the country. In addition, both the Bruins and Celtics are scheduled to be in town at the **Fleet Center**. Discount coupons for many area venues will be available at the NECS registration desk.


